Second Sunday of Advent - December 10th 2023

Gospel Reflection - Mark 1:1-8



The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ. Starting from what can we begin to live and plan again? From this good news. Never start again from pessimism, from problems, from the illusory primacy of a cruel reality that seems to dominate in the world. Starting over from bad news is only apparent intelligence, devoid of gospel wisdom. Starting again from God's good news: and immediately, from the first words, Mark shows how to recognize and welcome it. The whole experience of the spiritual man is summed up in these few verses. The first step leads to Isaiah and John and could be defined as follows: looking for prophets. Like Isaiah, a prophet is one who "opens paths" even in the desert, traces of hope even where it seemed impossible. The prophets, path openers and free men: to listen to them is to become like them. The second characteristic of every prophet is to be waiting, dissatisfied with what he has. Isaiah and John announce an Other (a more powerful one comes), have their center elsewhere: in a desire, a horizon, a person.

They announce that life is not static but ecstatic, coming out of oneself, living on the move. Like a prophet, every spiritual man is constantly on a journey, looking for what he does not yet have, his home is beyond: then he is ready for births and beginnings. Thirdly, a prophet is he who re-orients life: John preached a baptism of conversion for the forgiveness of sins. Sin is the experience of those who cannot reach their goal and have lost their way. Forgiveness is God who once again indicates the point of arrival and sets off again, the caravan that sets off again at dawn, the wind for the ship that sets sail. Forgiveness is a new beginning, a new sea, a new day. The forgiven sin no longer exists, annulled, erased, eliminated. And it is good that revokes evil. Good is worth more: good news of Jesus Christ. The Gospel is God coming bringing love, and all that is non-love is non-God.

Maranatha

If the season of Advent, which the Church now celebrates, were to have a sound-track, the reading we just heard would be the refrain: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." We prepare. Christ was born away in a manger well on 2,000 years ago . . . too late to prepare for that. Christ will come again in glory at the end of time . . . there's time to prepare for that, but it may be hard to keep on task. Christ is born in the heart of each and every man and woman, who bears his name - who dares to answer to the name "Christian" . . . now that is something we can prepare for! "Preparing the way of the Lord," means preparing ourselves for the birth of the Savior, who takes flesh in us, when we allow Christ's Spirit to form us, to breathe into us, to make us over into the image of Jesus. Christ is reborn in every Christian – in everyone, who can put away their old lives of living for themselves and put on the new life of living in Christ for others.

The season of Advent is a vigil. The word "vigil" means to keep watch during normal sleeping hours, to pay attention when others are sleeping. It comes from a very old Indo-European word "weg," which means "be lively or active." So to keep vigil or to be vigilant does not mean passive waiting but active, restless waiting, expectant waiting for the Lord. It means paying attention to what is going on in the world around us, and not being asleep. It means acting, living out our mission to be God's agents in the world.

The Advent tradition of the Church is vigil and prayer.

There are two places in the New Testament — 1 Corinthians and Revelation — where we find a prayer in the Aramaic language, the Semitic dialect spoken by Jesus. Since this prayer is in Aramaic it must come from the very earliest days of the Church. The prayer is "Marana tha" and means "Lord, come!" St. Augustine tells us that God is indebted to us, not because of anything we have done, but because of His promises. God always keeps His promises. So we call on Him to come again.

Our Advent prayer is "Lord, come!"

Lord, come — into our world!

Lord, come — into our lives!

Lord, come — and purify our longings!

Lord, come — to free us from our compulsions and sins!

Lord, come — into our relationships!

Lord, come — into our work!

Lord, come — into our sufferings!

And into the darkness of our troubled world.

We speak these words — "Marana tha" — with a real and confident urgency, not only for ourselves and our personal lives, but also for our Church and our nation.
