


St. Martha's Parish

4th Sunday of Lent - March 10th2024

Gospel Reflection - John 3:14-21



For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life: this verse is the source and the pivot around which the history of God with man dances. God loved, a past that endures and flourishes in today, a truth that absorbs everything; the whole biblical story begins with a "you are loved" and ends with "you will love" (P. Beauchamp). It is the happy news to repeat to ourselves at every awakening, at every difficulty, at every challenge. We are not Christians because we love God. We are Christians because we believe that God loves us. So that He gave us His Son... in the Gospel "to love" is always translated with another humble verb: "to give". God does nothing but eternally consider every man more important than himself. "So the world may know You

have sent Me and have loved them as You have loved Me" (Jn 17.23), the Father loves me as He loved Christ, with the same passion, the same trust, the same joy, in addition with with all the disappointments that I caused to Him. Everyone is the favorite child of God. Christ, who came from the Father as the giver of life, calls us to get rid of the image of a God with punitive intentions. Love is never scary, and knows no other punishment than suffering for not being welcome, not being reciprocated. And not just man, it is the whole world that is loved, says Jesus: the earth, the animals and plants and all of creation. And if He loved the world and its fragile beauty, then you too will love creation, you will love your neighbor. God did not send the Son to condemn the world, but for the world to be saved. God is not interested in instructing trials against us. God loved so much, and we can love like Him, because of His love: when I love, life doubles in me, my strength increases, I am happy. Each of my gestures of care, of tenderness, of friendship brings God's strength within me, opening a window onto the infinite. We commit ourselves not to save the world, He has already saved it, but to love it; not to convert people, He will do it, but to love them. If there is no love, no pulpit can say God; there is no bridge that reconnects the earth to the sky, the engine that restarts history, a history with a flavor of God.

Lent is about re-centering on God

It has been for some weeks that we are journeying on the path of Lent: how is this affecting us, where are we heading to? Before the liturgical reform of Vatican II, Lent was a period characterized by penances, sacrifices and mortifications. Today the Church invites us to "Repent and believe in the gospel", according to the first words spoken by Jesus in the Gospel of Mark (Mk 1,15). An invitation to change one's life, orienting one's existence to the good of others and to give adhesion to the good news of Jesus. The meaning of Lent lies in these two different theological approaches. Never in His teaching did Jesus invite you to do penance, to mortify yourself, much less to make sacrifices. Indeed, He said the opposite: "I want mercy and not sacrifices" (Mt 12.7). Sacrifices center man on himself, on his own spiritual perfection, mercy orients man towards the good of his brother. In fact, sacrifices, penances and mortifications only center man on himself, and nothing can be more dangerous and lethal than this attitude.

Paul of Tarsus, who as a fanatical Pharisee and a convinced advocate of these practices, once he met Jesus, went so far as to write in the Letter to the Colossians: Therefore do not let anyone judge you by what you eat or drink, or with regard to a religious festival, a New Moon celebration or a Sabbath day... Therefore let no one pass judgment on you in questions of food and drink, or with regard to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath. These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Let no one disqualify you, insisting on asceticism and worship of angels, going on in detail about visions, puffed up without reason by his sensuous mind, and not holding fast to the Head, from whom the whole body, nourished and knit together through its joints and ligaments, grows with a growth that is from God. If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the world, why, as if you were still alive in the world, do you submit to regulations— "Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch" — according to human precepts and teachings? These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting self-made religion and asceticism and severity to the body, but they are of no value in stopping the indulgence of the flesh. (Col 2,16.20-23). Paul understood very well that these practices center man on himself, in the mirage of an impossible spiritual perfection, as distant and unattainable as one's ambition is great. For this reason, Jesus instead invites immediate and concrete self-giving, as great as one's capacity to love is. Lent is not oriented towards Good Friday, but towards Easter of resurrection. For this reason it is not a time for mortifications, but for vivification. It is about discovering new, original, unprecedented forms of forgiveness, generosity and service, which raise the quality of one's love to put it in tune with that of the Living, and thus experience Easter as the fullness of Christ's life and one's own. The acceptance of the good news of Jesus ("Convert and believe in the gospel") is the vital element that enlivens our existence, makes us discover new original forms of love, and makes all those gift-giving abilities that are latent and were only waiting for the right moment to emerge.
