5th Sunday of Lent - March 17th 2024

Gospel Reflection - John 12:20-33



We would like to see Jesus: a request coming from the eternal soul of the man who seeks, a wish I feel it's mine. Jesus' response requires eyes that can look in depth: if you want to understand, look at the grain of wheat, look at the cross, the ultimate synthesis of the Gospel. If the grain of wheat does not die it remains just a grain of wheat, if it dies it produces a lot of fruit. That "if it dies" weighs on the heart and overshadows everything else. But if you observe, you see that the grain is actually a treasure chest of life that slowly opens, a small green miracle erupting. What happens in the earth is not the death of the seed but a tireless and wonderful work, a continuous and uninterrupted donation, a true gift of itself: the earth gives the grain its mineral elements, the grain offers the germ itself in nourishment. And when the grain has given

everything, the germ grows around with its roots hungry for life, grows upwards with the fragile and very powerful tip of its little leaves. Then the grain dies, yes, but in the sense that life is not taken away from it but transformed into a more evolved and powerful form of life. "What the caterpillar calls the end of the world everyone else calls a butterfly, he no longer crawls, he flies; he dies to his former life to continue living in a higher form". The main verb that governs the parable of the seed is "produces fruit". The glory of God is not dying but fruitfulness, and the trigger is the gift of self. The keystone that holds the world, from the grain to Christ, is not the victory of the strongest but the gift. The second icon offered by Jesus is the cross, the purest and highest image that God gave of Himself. To know who God is, I only have to kneel in front of the Cross (Karl Rahner). God enters death because every child of Him goes there. But from death He comes out as a germ from the earth, an indestructible form of life, and He drags us out, up, with Him. "The Cross was not given to us to understand but to cling to it" (Bonhoeffer): attracted by something that I do not understand, but which seduces and reassures me, I cling to His Cross, I walk with Him, eternally dying in His brothers, eternally resurgent. On the cross the divine art of loving offers itself to cosmic contemplation, it gives itself to the fruitfulness of lives.

Lent is about seeing with new eyes

God is the ultimate depth of everything that exists, Paul Tillich wrote, but we must learn to see. Jesus repeatedly asked his disciples, What do you see? For the reign of God is here and now. To the unbelievers he lamented, "It is because you say you see that your blindness remains" (John 9:41).

Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, the famous Jesuit scientist, was also a strong advocate of vision. "To see and to make others see" was the heart of his masterpiece, The Human Phenomenon. "The whole of life lies in that verb," he said. What kind of seeing is it that reveals not only the surfaces of things, but also their within? Here is the question that distinguishes physical sight from spiritual sight, as Antoine de Saint-Éxupery wrote in The Little Prince: "It is only with the heart that one sees rightly, what is essential is invisible to the physical eye."

Gospel vision calls us to see the incredible: this whole, crazy and chaotic world is God-filled. The Christian life is learning to see what is already present and to unite with what one sees; this is the sacramental life. We are invited to see the invisible in the visible, to experience, notice, accept and celebrate every miracle of life, whether a tiny twig, a small flower, or a burly human, because everything is bursting with divine life. All of creation is pregnant with the infinite love of God; God is forever loving the world with all that God is. God is dynamically engaged in every aspect of physical life, from the beginning, drawing all through love into the fullness of being.

Jesus' resurrection is a statement about how reality works: always moving toward resurrection. As the Catholic funeral preface says, "Life is not ended but merely changed." This is the divine mystery of transformation, which is entirely evident in the physical universe. This is the good news of the Easter message. God is not dead or absent or retired; God is active and alive, here and now. God is doing new things and we are invited into this dance of ever-flowing life.

If we are to speak of miracles, the most miraculous thing of all is that God uses the very thing that would normally destroy you—the tragic, the sorrowful, the painful, the unjust—to transform and enlighten you.

This is a human transformation to a much higher level of love and consciousness. You have been plucked from the flames of any would-be death to the soul, and you have become a very different kind of human being in this world. Jesus is indeed

saving the world.- Ilia Delio, R. Rohr





Each of us faces the question of how we are going to allow the grain of our life to die, and what the harvest might be if we do so. But if we want to follow Christ, we cannot avoid this death: a dying to ourselves, and a giving of ourselves in God's service.
