We live in a time of crisis What has the crisis revealed to the Church

Technological and economic developments = a divide between generations sense of isolation and a tendency to self absorption.

loneliness of the elderly - helplessness and a lack of shared vision - comfortable consumerist isolation - connected but not really involved.

<u>Elderly despondency</u> - a sense of no special content - Contempt for old age and its symptoms of frailty decay has been the dominant image Youth contain full meaning of life.

Responses to what crisis has revealed

a functional retreat - with a shrug. fundamentalism. Truth and reality possesses us - the enemy is always strident insistent monotonous - throwaway culture and in this culture of productivity.

<u>Mirages:</u> fed ourselves dreams of splendor and grandeur- idyllic and perfect love needing no stimulus to grow - hero receives a happy ending - Self-help - daydreams or fantasies can alienate

God's dream

Pascal offers a vision of the three order... for the way in which human life grows - it is up to us to be good or bad honest or dishonest. a Christian dream with God - this dream whose name is Jesus planted by the father - a concrete dream who is a person running through our veins

creation is groaning from - we are called to be protagonists

<u>We need to bridge the generations</u> - <u>intergenerational exchanges...</u> children because they lead history forward the elderly transmit the experience and wisdom of their lives - Unity of the stages of life

<u>Keys to building the bridge</u> - the elderly are our roots our source our sustenance

- concreteness of a real person
- dream as a single human family
- hope patience and commitment.
- Closeness is a precious asset

To keep alive the certainty that another world is indeed - that a life without love is an arid life – that we Must be firmly rooted in the present and from here revisit the past

<u>Pope Francis' Dreams</u> a missionary option capable of transforming everything four dreams a social dream a cultural dream an ecological dream and an ecclesial dream.

Saint Paul VI - need a fire in her heart - words on her lips - prophecy in her gaze - to the elders is reserved the charism of having dreams - to the youth that of having visions - memory keepers we grand parents need form a choir.
